MUNICIPAL TAXES

Please take note that the FIRST (1ST) instalment for municipal tax was due on March 30, 2025, the second instalment is due on JUNE 28TH, 2025 and the last instalment is due SEPTEMBER 26, 2025.



Act respecting municipal taxation Chapter F-2.1 Article 81; The clerk shall, before March 1st each year, mail a tax account to every person

Act respecting municipal taxation Chapter F-2.1 Article 252; The latest date on which a single payment or first instalment of municipal property taxes may be paid is the thirtieth day following the sending of the account; where the taxes may be paid in two instalments, the latest date on which the second instalment may be paid is the ninetieth day following the last day on which the first instalment may be paid.

NEW: The municipality can now accept online payments from the following financial institutions: Caisse Desjardins, CIBC, Scotiabank, National Bank, Laurentian, BMO, Tangerine, and RBC.

Also, please note that the municipality now offers the possibility to pay taxes with debit card at the town hall.

The Municipality has hired an EXPERT PREVENTION service provider to carry out door-to-door inspections of low and medium risk buildings/dwellings and smoke detector checks.

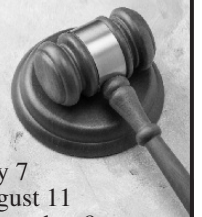

ANIMALS

Please take note that farm animals are authorized only in agricultural zone.

Consequently, animals such: horses, goats, rabbits, sheep, ducks, hens, bee, etc are not authorized in the white zones including the residential zones.

ANIMALS BY-LAW

In accordance with article 11 of the Animals By-law in non-agricultural areas It is allowed to keep up to 4 animals including a maximum of 2 dogs and 2 cats. In the case of a building with more than 2 units, only one dog and two cats are allowed per unit. In agricultural areas, it is allowed to keep up to 5 dogs.

Remember that due to provincial By-law P-38.002, which came into force on March 3, 2020, any owner of a dog must register his pet with the Municipality. No later than July 1 of each year, each dog owner must obtain a license at a cost of \$25 a dog.

Dog licenses

Any dog on Hinchinbrooke territory must have a valid license.

The Municipality of Hinchinbrooke has implemented this regulation with the objective of ensuring the safety of citizens, as well as that of pets. In the event of an animal running away or in the event of a dispute, having an animal register makes it possible to identify the owner more easily and quickly.

In fact, the license allows the Municipality and the SPCA Ouest which recovers a lost dog to quickly identify it and inform the owner of the animal. It is also required by provincial law which requires a city to be able to identify them.

You must obtain a permanent, non-transferable license for your dog, and renew the right each year within the prescribed deadlines.

License cost: \$25 annually (indivisible and non-refundable)

If you do not have access to the internet, it is possible to do it in person, during the door-to-door census carried out by the SPCA Ouest team.



You will receive by mail a numbered medallion unique to your pet that it must wear at all times.

GARAGE SALE LONG WEEKENDS

Garage sale long weekends, May 17th to May 19th inclusively and August 30st to September 1st inclusively. The municipality does not require a permit for the citizens to hold a garage sale on these dates.

FIREWORKS:

To celebrate Saint Jean Baptiste and Canada Day Fireworks will be held – Saturday June 28, 2025 at the Athelstan Baseball Field. You can bring your lawn chairs and watch the fireworks in the park or enjoy it from your vehicle.

OUTDOOR FIRES

All types of outdoor fires are prohibited without first obtaining a burn permit. Burn permits are required between **April 1 and November 15** of each year. Burn permits are issued free of charge by the Municipal Fire Warden, who must be contacted a **minimum of 5 days in advance before the permit is required**. Please contact the Town Hall.

All types of outdoor fires must be done in a container or an exterior fireplace. Take note that stone fire pits are no longer accepted. You can check on the Sopfeu to see the restrictions to make fires.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Please note that you must dismantle temporary shelters (TEMPO) no later than May 1st. Fines for violations are \$500.

In order to facilitate the work for municipal employees when cutting weeds on the roadside all fences erected in the road allowance must be removed.

The occupation of a caravan, trailer, trailer or camping tent is prohibited throughout the territory of the municipality outside the limits of a campsite.

Hinchinbrooke Volunteer Breakfast

Hinchinbrooke volunteer fire brigade breakfast. May 18th, 2025 8 a.m. to noon. This year the breakfast will be served inside the Athelstan fire station. Tickets are available from the fire department for \$20 each or can be purchased at the door.

NUISANCES

It is declared a nuisance and prohibits the proprietor, the lessee or the occupant of an immovable to deposit or leave, or permit that it be deposited or left on an immovable:

- Dead branches, scrap of demolition, construction materials, pieces of asphalt or concrete, scrap, waste, pieces of furniture or domestic appliances out of use, paper, empty bottles or glass;
- Damage and unfit for habitation buildings;
- Tall weeds or grass exceeding 30cm;
- One or more automobile vehicles out of function, automobile carcass, parts of vehicles or used tire;

INSTALLING A POOL THIS YEAR



Are you thinking of installing an in-ground, above-ground or inflatable pool this year? Before installing it, you must obtain a permit for this purpose from the municipality while respecting provincial regulations. www.quebec.ca/habitation-territoire/piscines-et-spas/securite-piscines-residentielles/securisez-piscine.



DO YOU ALREADY HAVE A POOL INSTALLED?

The Regulation applies to all swimming pools, regardless of their installation date. Owners of a swimming pool installed before November 1, 2010, and who previously benefited from an exemption, have until September 30, 2025 to comply.

To comply with new government regulations (Loi sur la sécurité des piscines résidentielles (chapitre S-3.1.02, a. 1) all pools in the municipality must be inspected for conformity and registered by the municipal inspector and/or a person mandated by the municipal council. Please note that if you have a pool the inspections will begin this spring and continue through summer and fall weather permitting. If you have any questions or concerns please contact the municipality.

WORK

In order to allow a better quality of the environment for each one, take note that the use of mowers, mechanical saw or any other power tool as well as the execution of construction work causing noise is allowed Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday between 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (does not apply to the agricultural work carried out to farmable land).

SPRING CLEANING

After the snow is gone, we notice that several properties need maintenance and cleaning. In order to preserve a pleasant environment for all we ask you to proceed with the collect of all nuisances and to see at the maintenance of the property.

In the case of non respect of municipal by-laws on the matter, a fine of a minimum of 300\$ could be imposed to you.

TO EMPTY THE SEPTIC TANKS

It is important to empty the septic tanks as stipulated in article 13 of the By-law on the treatment and drainage of used water for insulated residences Q.2, r-22 which obliges one to empty the septic tanks according to the following frequency:

- Once every 2 years for permanent residences
- Once every 4 years for seasonal residences.

Remember that a used and well-maintained septic installation is an adequate way to see its lifespan extended and thus protect the environment.

USED TIRES

Please take note that used tires as well as tractor tires must be deposited at a garage or dealer.

DITCHES

If anyone digs or cleans a road ditch, please contact the Town Hall so a town employee can be on the site to oversee the job.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS CONNECTED TO THE ATHELSTAN WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

While making an effort to maintain the minimum cost of operation for the used water treatment plant in Athelstan, the Hinchinbrooke administration requires you to refrain from putting waste in the toilet.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Municipality of Hinchinbrooke would like to remind its citizens that the space between the boundary of private property and the edge of the street or road is the Municipality's right-of-way. This space ranging from one meter to a few meters deep, depending on the sector, type of road and for security reasons, this municipal space must remain devoid of any objects or plantings.

We ask for your cooperation in maintaining a safe and pleasant living environment for all. Furthermore, we have received numerous reports of all-terrain vehicles, including ATVs, operating on public roads. We remind you that the Highway Safety Code prohibits their use on public roads except to cross a roadway or if road signs permit access. If you notice the presence of these vehicles on a public road, do not hesitate to report it to the Sûreté du Québec police station, Ormstown division.

Neighborhood courtesy is the foundation for a good quality of life for everyone. Thus, bylaw 440 on nuisances prohibits the creation of noise (music, festivities, shouting, etc.) likely to disturb the peace and well-being of others and that is audible at the property line. Similarly, the use of fireworks is also prohibited.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Garbage Collection

Garbage is collected every WEDNESDAY. Garbage should be placed at the roadside no earlier than 6:00 pm the evening before the collection. Please take note that garbage and recycling should not be put in front of the mailboxes.

Recycling

Every second Monday of the month there is a door-to-door collection.

Please contact the Town Hall to receive the recycling guide which explains what materials are acceptable for collection.

Organic Waste Collection (Compost)

In order to comply with new government regulations and to be eligible for government subsidies 120L brown bins will be distributed by the municipality in April/May. Once the bins are delivered, collections will begin every two weeks between May and October. The start date and collection days will be published on the municipality's website, and a schedule will be posted at town hall.

ECOCENTRE

Another new development for 2025: the Municipality of Hinchinbrooke has entered into an agreement with the Municipality of Franklin to offer an ecocentre to all Hinchinbrooke residents. The site will be located at 2177 Chemin Demers, next to the Lac des Pins campground on Route 201. The site will be operational starting May 23, 2025.

Hours: From April 4 to November 30, open Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays (8 hours per day). Every Saturday in December, January, February, and March (8 hours per day).

Materials accepted: Metal, wood, construction materials, garbage, cardboard, paint, used oil, batteries, electronics, and tires.

USE OF MARITIME CONTAINERS

Recently there has been a huge increase in the amount of shipping containers that have entered out municipality.

REMINDER : A PERMIT IS REQUIRED

The use of a shipping container for the purpose of an ACCESSORY BUILDING, may be authorized under specific conditions, as stated in article 4.5.1.1 of our zoning by-law #378.

A shipping container CANNOT be used as the principal building.

The municipality may, for the purposes of applying the provisions of this by-law, any person who contravenes the by-laws may be liable to a fine of at least \$500, per day, and per infraction.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Sale for unpaid taxes. The MRC du Haut-Saint-Laurent will be proceeding with the sale for taxes for unpaid municipal taxes on June 12TH, 2025. Please ensure your municipal taxes are up to date in order to avoid having your property put up for sale. Please consult the MRC's website for further information at www.mrchsl.com.

SPECIALIZED PAINTS

Two-component paints (Epoxy)
Paints designed for artistic use
Antifouling paints
Wood preservative or conservation products categorized as pesticides

PAINT RELATED PRODUCTS

Strippers, solvents and thinners

OTHER PRODUCTS

Grout, plaster, joint cement, plastic wood and specialty coatings (e.g., Stucco)
Adhesives and glues
Products (or coatings) for roofing and foundations
Products for asphalt driveways and crack fillers
Cleaners and polishes (e.g. patio cleaner, lemon oil)
Unidentified or unlabeled containers
Paints in glass containers

PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

When is it necessary to obtain a permit or certificate?

Anyone who wishes to undertake an activity that requires the issuance of a license or certificate under the municipal by-law must obtain this license or certificate from the municipal inspector **BEFORE** starting the works. The table below gives a non-exhaustive list of activities and whether if you need a permit or certificate or not. If in doubt, it is always preferable to contact the urbanism services of the municipality before starting your project. If you are planning projects requiring a permit, please foresee a 30 days delay for the emission of your permit.

* Obtaining a certificate of authorization or a permit is not required for certain works required for normal maintenance of a construction, as described in the table above, however, this applies to menus work separately and not for a series of work.

To avoid delaying your projects, it is suggested to place your request for a permit or certificate a few weeks in advance.

Remember that when you are in contravention with the by-law, even if a permit is required or not, you are liable to a fine. So be vigilant in preparing your projects.

FLASHING GREEN LIGHT IN A VEHICLE OPERATED BY A FIREFIGHTER

As of April 1, 2021, the Flashing Green Light Regulation is in force in Québec. The Regulation allows firefighters who use their personal vehicles to install a courtesy light to make it faster for them to get to the scene of an emergency. Firefighters who receive an emergency call from a fire safety service may activate a flashing green light when travelling to the fire station or the scene of an emergency. The flashing green light helps other road users identify firefighters travelling to an emergency and encourages them to behave with courtesy.



SALE OF MUNICIPAL VEHICLE

The municipality of Hinchinbrooke is selling its **2002 Chevrolet Silverado 3500**. This vehicle has **330,163 km**, is equipped with a **6.6 L Duramax diesel engine** and automatic transmission. Comes with a valid inspection, and is a 2wd. The municipality will be taking sealed bids until May 8th at 9:00 am. There will be a reserve set at \$9,500.00 for the sale of this vehicle.

What to put, or not to put, in the recycling bin?

Containers, packaging, printed matter. That's it.

DID YOU KNOW?

- A container comes with a cap or a lid.
- Packaging is used to easily transport a product.
- Containers and packaging made of degradable plastic should not be placed in the bin. They will contaminate all other recyclable materials.

EXAMPLES OF CONTAINERS AND PACKAGING

- ✓ Household cleaning product container
- ✓ Packaging, jar and container of food products
- ✓ Cardboard box
- ✓ Aluminum foil and plate
- ✓ Packaging of takeaway and prepared food



EXAMPLES OF PRINTED PAPER

- ✓ Newspapers and flyers
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Lined or squared paper sheets
- ✓ Notebooks



EXCEPTIONS

- Aerosols: contact your Municipality to find out if a drop-off point exists, or take them to the household hazardous waste collections (MRC).
- Polystyrene protective packaging: drop-off point coming soon.



GOOD MOVES

- Empty and lightly rinse out containers.
- Remove lids from jars and containers – except for small caps.
- Separate different materials from the same container or packaging (i.e bag of cereals in a cereal box).
- Crush aluminum sheets into compact balls, even when lightly used, before placing them in the bin.
- Undo and fold your cardboard boxes.
