MUNICIPAL TAXES

Please note that the FIRST (1ST) installment for tax payment is due on March 30, 2026, the second installment is due on June 29, 2026, and the final installment is due on September 28, 2026.



If you did not receive your tax bill, please contact the municipality right away as all tax bills have been mailed out. It is the responsibility of the citizen to ensure that they have received their tax bills. If you move or change address you must inform the municipality right away to ensure your tax bill is mailed to the correct address. It is the responsibility of the citizens to ensure the municipality has the proper mailing address.

Municipal Taxation Act Chapter F-2.1 Section 81; The clerk must, before March 1 of each year, mail a tax bill to each person.

Municipal Taxation Act Chapter F-2.1 Section 252; The deadline by which a single payment or first installment of municipal property taxes may be paid is the thirtieth day following the sending of the bill; where taxes may be paid in two installments, the deadline by which the second installment may be paid is the

ninetieth day following the last day by which the first installment may be paid.

The municipality can now accept online payments from the following financial institutions: Caisse Desjardins, CIBC, Scotiabank, National Bank, Laurentian, BMO, Tangerine and RBC.

Also note that the municipality now offers the option to pay taxes by debit card at City Hall.

GARAGE SALE

From Saturday 17 to Monday 19 May, and from Saturday 30 August to Monday 1 September, the municipality does not require any permit for citizens to organize a garage sale.




PUBLIC MEETING SCHEDULE

Article 148 of the *Quebec Municipal Code* stipulates that the council must establish, before the start of each calendar year, the schedule of its regular meetings for the following year, setting the day and time of the start of each meeting.

SPEED LIMITS – PARK DAVIGNON

Speed limit signs have been installed throughout Davignon Park. Following increasing requests and complaints from residents, the speed limit on all gravel paths in the park has been set at 15 km/h.

The maximum speed limit on Main is 40 km/h. This measure will contribute to everyone's safety and will also help reduce the amount of dust during the summer.





ANIMALS

Please note that farm animals are only permitted in agricultural areas. Therefore, animals such as horses, goats, rabbits, sheep, ducks, chickens, bees, etc., are not allowed in white zones, including residential and urban areas.

ANIMAL BY-LAWS

Under Article 11 of the Animal By-Laws, in non-agricultural areas, up to four animals are permitted, including a maximum of two dogs and two cats. In buildings with more than two dwellings, only one dog and two cats are allowed per dwelling. In agricultural areas, up to five dogs are permitted.

Please remember that due to provincial regulation P-38.002, which came into effect on March 3, 2020, all dog owners must register their animal with the Municipality. By July 1st of each year, each dog owner must obtain a license at a cost of \$25 per dog.

DOG LICENSES

Every dog on the territory of Hinchinbrooke must have a valid license.



The Municipality of Hinchinbrooke implemented this regulation to ensure the safety of its citizens and pets. In the event of an animal running away or a dispute, having an animal registry makes it easier and faster to identify the owner.

Indeed, the license allows the Municipality and the SPCA West, which recovers a lost dog, to quickly identify it and inform the owner. It is also required by provincial law, which mandates that a city be able to identify them.

You must obtain a permanent, non-transferable license for your dog and renew it annually within the prescribed time limits.

License fee: \$25 annually (non-refundable and indivisible)

You will receive by mail a numbered and unique medallion for your pet which it must wear at all times.

FIRE PREVENTION INSPECTIONS

The Municipality has hired a PREVENTION EXPERT service provider to conduct door-to-door inspections of low-risk buildings/homes and verifications of smoke detectors.

The MRC has also hired a preventative worker to conduct door-to-door inspections of medium and high-risk buildings. These inspections will begin soon.

OUTDOOR FIRES

Outdoor fires without a burning permit are prohibited between April 1 and November 15 each year. Burning permits (free of charge) can be obtained from the municipal fire warden, a minimum of 5 days in advance of the permit being issued. Please contact City Hall for more information.

For all residents of the municipality, outdoor fires must be made in a container or outdoor fire pit. However, stones placed around a fire pit will no longer be permitted. You can check the SOPFEU website for fire restrictions.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Please note that you must dismantle the temporary shelters (TEMPO) by May 1st. Fines for non-compliance are \$500.

To facilitate the work of municipal workers during the maintenance of the road network (mowing, snow removal etc.) all fences currently erected within the road allowance of streets must be removed.

The occupation of a caravan, trailer, camper or camping tent is prohibited throughout the municipality outside the boundaries of a campground.

SPECIAL REMINDER - SHIPPING CONTAINERS

The municipality has observed an increase in the use of shipping containers within its territory. It has also received numerous complaints and questions on this subject. As explained in detail in our last winter bulletin (Vol. 16 – No. 1), the use of shipping containers requires a permit and is subject to regulations and requirements. As indicated in the last bulletin, the municipality will focus on this issue in 2026.

BREAKFAST FOR THE HINCHINBROOKE VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS

Tickets are available prior through a member of the fire department or at the door on the day of the event. You can eat at the station, or you can take it out.

A SWIMMING POOL WILL BE INSTALLED THIS YEAR

Are you planning to install an in-ground, above-ground, or inflatable pool this year? Before proceeding with the installation, you must obtain a permit from your municipality and comply with provincial regulations. www.quebec.ca/habitation-territoire/piscines-et-spas/securite-piscines-residentielles/securisez-piscine





DO YOU ALREADY HAVE A SWIMMING POOL INSTALLED?

In order to comply with new government regulations (Residential Swimming Pool Safety Act (chapter S-3.1.02, s. 1)), all municipal swimming pools must be inspected for compliance and recorded by the municipal inspector or a person mandated by the municipal council. Please note that if you own a pool, inspections will begin this spring and continue throughout the summer and fall, weather permitting. The two municipal employees designated to conduct these inspections are Darren Casement and Chelsea Daniel. For any questions or concerns, please contact the town hall.

WORKS

In order to allow a better quality of environment for everyone, please note that the use of lawnmowers, chainsaws or any other mechanical tool as well as the execution of construction work causing noise is permitted from Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. and on Saturday and Sunday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. (does not apply to agricultural work carried out on cultivated land).

SPRING CLEANING

After the snow has melted and gone away several properties require maintenance and cleaning. To preserve a pleasant environment for everyone, we ask that you remove any debris and ensure the properties are properly maintained.

Failure to comply with municipal regulations in this matter may result in a fine of at least \$300.

SEPTIC TANK EMPTYING

It is important to ensure that septic tanks are emptied as stipulated in Article 13 of the Regulation respecting the treatment and disposal of wastewater from isolated dwellings Q.2,r -22, which requires emptying at the following frequency:

- Once every two years for permanent residents
- Once every 4 years for seasonal residences.

Remember that a properly used and maintained septic system has an optimized lifespan while ensuring environmental protection.

Please note that used tires and tractor tires must be dropped off at a garage or dealership.

DITCH

If anyone is digging or cleaning a ditch at the side of the road, please contact the town hall so that a municipal employee can be on site.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS CONNECTED TO THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

While making an effort to keep the operating cost of the wastewater treatment plant in Athelstan to a minimum, the Hinchinbrooke administration asks you to refrain from putting garbage in the toilet.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Municipality of Hinchinbrooke reminds its residents that the area between a private property line and the edge of the street or road constitutes the municipal right-of-way. This municipal space, which can range from one to several meters in depth, depending on the area and type of road, must, for safety reasons, remain free of any objects or plantings.

We ask for your cooperation in maintaining a safe and pleasant living environment for everyone. Furthermore, we have received numerous reports of all-terrain vehicles, particularly ATVs, operating on public roads. We remind you that the Highway Safety Code prohibits their use on public roads except for crossing a pedestrian crossing or where road signs permit access. If you observe these vehicles on public roads, please

Courtesy towards neighbors is essential for a good quality of life for everyone. Therefore, by-law 440 on nuisances prohibits the creation of noise (music, celebrations, shouting, etc.) likely to disturb the peace and well-being of others and audible at the property line. Similarly, the use of fireworks is also prohibited.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Garbage collection

Garbage collection is on Wednesdays. Garbage must not be placed at the curb before 6:00 p.m. the evening before collection. Also, please note that garbage and recycling should not be placed near mailboxes.

Recycling collection

Generally, collection is carried out door-to-door every other Monday of each month.



To check which materials are accepted for recycling, please contact the town hall to receive your guide.

Collection of organic matter (compost)

Collections will begin every two weeks between May and October. The start date will be May 7, 2026, and collection days will be published on the municipality's website and a calendar will be posted at the town hall.

SALE FOR TAX

Property Sale for Tax Purposes. The Haut-Saint-Laurent MRC will be holding a property sale for unpaid municipal taxes on June 11, 2026. PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

When is it necessary to obtain a permit or certificate?

Anyone who wishes to undertake an activity that requires the issuance of a license or certificate under the municipal by-law must obtain this license or certificate from the municipal inspector **BEFORE** starting the works. The table below gives a non-exhaustive list of activities and whether if you need a permit or certificate or not. If in doubt, it is always preferable to contact the urbanism services of the municipality before starting your project. If you are planning projects requiring a permit, please foresee a 30 days delay for the emission of your permit.

* Obtaining a certificate of authorization or a permit is not required for certain works required for normal maintenance of a construction, as described in the table.

To avoid delaying your projects, it is suggested to place your request for a permit or certificate a few weeks in advance.

Remember that when you are in contravention with the by-law, even if a permit is required or not, you are liable to a fine. So be vigilant in preparing your projects.

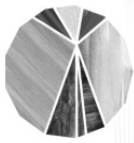

2026 SCHEDULE BUS TRANSPORTATION

Certified true copy of resolution no. 11336-02-26 adopted by the Regional Council of the MRC of Haut-Saint-Laurent on February 18, 2026

Extract from the minutes of the Regional Council meeting held on February 18, 2026, and chaired by Mr. Yves Métras, Prefect and Mayor of the Municipality of Franklin.

WHEREAS the declaration of jurisdiction for public and adapted transportation adopted on February 5, 2020 (resolution no. 04-02-20);

WHEREAS the adoption of the by-laws declaring jurisdiction for public and adapted transportation on June 3, 2020 (resolutions nos. 8782-06-20 and 8783-06-20);

WHEREAS bus transportation services are subject to a service schedule;

WHEREAS a new 2026 timetable was tabled at the meeting of February 18, 2026;

WHEREAS any changes to a municipal public transit service timetable must be published in service vehicles and a local newspaper at least 30 days before they come into effect. Transportation Act (CQLR, c. T-12, section 48.24)

THEREFORE, it is moved by:
Mr. Mark Wallace
Seconded by:

Ms. Deborah Stewart and unanimously resolved, To adopt the new 2026 timetable as presented at the meeting of February 18, 2026, and to authorize its entry into force on April 1, 2026;

To proceed with its publication in service vehicles, newspapers, and the website of the MRC du Haut-Saint-Laurent, and to its distribution to the municipalities of Haut-Saint-Laurent, to educational institutions, and to regional transportation services, starting February 25, 2026.
