INSTALLING A SWIMMING POOL

Are you planning to install an in-ground, above-ground or inflatable pool this year? Before installing it, you must obtain a certificate of authorization to this effect from the municipality. Visit the website www.quebec.ca/habitation-territoire/piscines-et-spas/securite-piscines-residentielles/securisez-piscine.

POOL INSPECTIONS

In order to comply with provincial regulations, all pools must be inspected and registered by the municipality. Starting in June and until weather conditions permit, employees mandated by the municipality will inspect the pools located on its territory. These employees will wear a vest marked "Inspector". The two municipal employees designated to conduct these inspections are Darren Casement and Chelsea Daniel. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Town Hall.



MUNICIPAL TAXES

Please note that the second installment is due on June 29, 2026 and the third installment on September 28, 2026. Please note that there is a slot at the door of the Town Hall to deposit a check in case of scheduling conflicts for the payment of your taxes. Payments can be made online at all financial institutions. The municipality also accepts debit payments at the counter at Town Hall.



PUBLIC MEETING SCHEDULE

Article 148 of the *Quebec Municipal Code* stipulates that the council must establish, before the start of each calendar year, the schedule of its regular meetings for the following year, setting the day and time of the start of each meeting.

ANIMALS

In non-agricultural areas, it is forbidden to keep more than four animals, including a maximum of two dogs and two cats, per dwelling, including outbuildings. In addition, it is forbidden to own farm animals such as: horses, goats, rabbits, sheep, ducks, chickens, bees, etc.

In agricultural areas, a maximum of five dogs is allowed. Farm animals are allowed as long as the safety distances are respected.

Please note that any animal kept outside a building must be restrained or immobilized by means of a device preventing it from leaving the land where it is located, such as a lanyard, a leash, a fence, etc., both for a domestic animal such as: a dog, a cat, a ferret, a guinea pig, etc. than for a farm animal such as: a cow, a goat, a horse, a pig, a chicken, etc.

We remind you that it is neither desirable nor recommended to feed wild animals, as this changes their natural behavior. They then approach inhabited areas and traffic lanes, increasing the risk of being hit by a vehicle. In addition, they can pose a risk to humans and pets, whether through disease transmission or bites.

This is a health and safety issue for citizens and pets.

NEW ANIMAL SERVICE PROVIDER

As of June 1st, the municipality of Hinchinbrooke no longer uses the services of the SPCA West. The municipality has hired Isabelle Robert to handle all questions and complaints about animals. Miss Robert will also be responsible for the registration and licensing of dogs. If you have not yet registered your dog for 2026, please contact Ms. Robert. OUTDOOR FIRES

Outdoor fires without a permit are prohibited from **April 1 to November 15** of each year. A fire permit (free) can be obtained **at least 5 days in advance**. Please contact the town hall for more information. **For all residents of the municipality, outdoor fires must be made in an outdoor container or fireplace. However, stones around a hole will no longer be accepted.**

GARAGE SALES

The municipality wishes to inform citizens that no permit will be required to hold a garage sale during the September long weekend, from Friday, August 28 to Monday, August 31. If you wish to hold a garage sale outside of this date, you must obtain a permit.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Temporary shelters (TEMPO) are prohibited from May 1 to November 1 of each year. Summer TEMPOs are prohibited in the municipality. This includes the metal structure of the tempo.

To facilitate the work of municipal workers during the maintenance of the road network (mowing, snow removal, etc.), all fences currently erected in the street right-of-way must be removed.

The occupation of a caravan, caravan, caravan or camping tent is prohibited throughout the territory of the municipality outside the boundaries of a camping pitch.

DO YOU WANT TO FILE A COMPLAINT

The municipality wishes to inform citizens that only official complaints will be processed. To file a formal complaint, a complaint form must be completed at Town Hall.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Garbage collection

Garbage collection takes place on **WEDNESDAY**. Household waste must not be deposited on the side of the road before 6 p.m. the day before. If you plan to take it out on collection day, please make sure it is placed on the road **before 6 a.m.** In addition, it is important not to deposit household garbage and recyclable materials near mailboxes.

There is also a collection point for agricultural plastics, which takes place every second Wednesday of the month. You can request transparent bags by contacting the town hall.

The depot site for paints, oils, etc. is located at 315 Route 202, Hinchinbrooke, at the new municipal garage. Please note that this is not a waste site; Only the items listed above are accepted.

DO YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT A PROPERTY IN HINCHINBROOKE?

The municipality wishes to inform citizens that Hinchinbrooke is now accessible on the Géocentralis public website. You can obtain the following information (owner, lot number, property assessment, flood zone, zoning) on all properties located in Hinchinbrooke via the www.geocentralis.com/acces-grand-public website.

BE VIGILANT

The municipality receives many calls and complaints about speeding vehicles in the streets of Davignon Park. Be careful, many families and children frequent this area. Be careful and drive slowly, especially on gravel roads where downtime is longer, roads narrower, and dust present.

MOUNTAIN BIKING ON PUBLIC ROADS

Please note that provincial law prohibits ATVs from being driven on public roads. Fines may apply for non-compliance with these rules.



NUISANCES

The owner, tenant or occupant of an immovable is prohibited from depositing or leaving, or permitting to be deposited or left on an immovable, the following is declared a nuisance and prohibited:

- Dead branches, demolition debris, building materials, pieces of asphalt or concrete, scrap metal, garbage, furniture or appliances that are out of order, paper, empty bottles or glass;
- Damaged and unfit buildings;
- Tall weeds or grasses exceeding 30 cm;
- One or more end-of-life motor vehicles, car carcasses, vehicle parts or used tires;

Unidentified or unlabeled containers

PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

When is it necessary to obtain a permit or certificate?

Anyone who wishes to undertake an activity that requires the issuance of a license or certificate under the municipal by-law must obtain this license or certificate from the municipal inspector **BEFORE** starting the works. The table below gives a non-exhaustive list of activities and whether if you need a permit or certificate or not. If in doubt, it is always preferable to contact the urbanism services of the municipality before starting your project. If you are planning projects requiring a permit, please foresee a 30 days delay for the emission of your permit.

* Obtaining a certificate of authorization or a permit is not required for certain works required for normal maintenance of a construction, as described in the table.

To avoid delaying your projects, it is suggested to place your request for a permit or certificate a few weeks in advance.

Remember that when you are in contravention with the by-law, even if a permit is required or not, you are liable to a fine. So be vigilant in preparing your projects.

SUMMER CLOSURE DURING THE TOWN HALL HOLIDAY PERIOD

Please note that this summer the town hall will be open all throughout the summer.

LAWNCARE

In order to provide a better-quality environment for all, please note that the use of lawnmowers, power saws or any other mechanical tool as well as the execution of construction work causing noise are authorized from Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. (does not apply to agricultural work carried out on cultivated land).

CLEANING

The municipality notes that several properties require maintenance and cleaning work. In order to preserve a pleasant environment for all, we ask you to clean up all nuisances and to ensure the maintenance of the flower beds.

In the event of non-compliance with the municipal by-laws in this area, you may be fined a minimum of \$300.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS CONNECTED TO THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

While working to keep the cost of operating the Athelstan Wastewater Treatment Plant to a minimum, the Hinchinbrooke Administration is asking that you refrain from flushing waste other than toilet paper.

RIVER OWNERS

A little reminder to local residents: your property has a 10 to 15-metre-wide riparian strip between the natural environment and the land. Left to itself, it fulfills multiple ecological functions necessary for the proper functioning of aquatic ecosystems and the maintenance of the integrity of their biological communities.

No work is allowed within this riparian buffer, including mowing and landscaping. For more details, we suggest that you contact the municipal inspector.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Municipality of Hinchinbrooke reminds its citizens that the space between the boundary of a private property and the edge of the street or road constitutes the municipal right-of-way. This municipal space, whose depth can vary from one to several meters depending on the sector and the type of path, must, for safety reasons, remain free of any object or planting.

DITCH

If someone is digging or clearing a ditch on the side of the road, please contact Town Hall so that a municipal employee can be on site.

EMPTYING SEPTIC TANKS

It is important to ensure the emptying of septic tanks as stipulated in section 13 of the Regulation respecting the treatment and disposal of wastewater from isolated dwellings Q.2,r-22, which requires emptying at the following frequency:

- **Once every 2 years for permanent residences**
- **Once every 4 years for seasonal residences.**

Don't forget that a septic system that is properly used and maintained has an optimized lifespan while ensuring the protection of the environment.

WATER EXTRACTION

Town Council has passed a new by-law, By-law 378-28, which guarantees that no new permits to take water for commercial purposes will be issued.

NEW POWERSCOURT HYDRO-GEOLOGICAL STUDY

A communication has been sent to the municipality of Québec Inc. (2961-4179) concerning the new hydrogeological study. If you wish to consult it, it is available on the municipality's website: www.hinchinbrooke.com.

SPEED RADAR

The municipality has installed a speed radar on Route 202 toward Rockburn from Herdman. Another radar will soon be installed on Route 202 from Franklin. Finally, a speed radar has been installed on the Fairview road from Dewittville. These radars were installed following numerous concerns and requests from citizens. It is also important to note that two of them did not cost the municipality anything, thanks to a grant from the provincial government.

SHOP / CAFÉ / SNACK BAR OPEN IN HERDMAN

The Marché du Vieux Bois, located at the 4 corners of Herdman, is open again and ready to welcome you. If you need something or want to eat, don't hesitate to take a look.

PRESENCE OF TICKS IN THE AREA

Lyme disease can be transmitted through the bite of an infected tick. The number of infected persons in the Montérégie region is on the rise. Tick populations are now established in the region and are found primarily in forests, woods and tall grass. The risk of tick bites is highest from June to August, but caution is advised well into the fall months. Adults and children who engage in outdoor activities in or near a forest (hiking, biking, tree cutting, wood gathering, camping, hunting, gardening, etc.), and certain types of workers (road workers, camp counsellors, etc.) are more likely to be exposed to ticks.

To lower your risk of infection while you continue to enjoy the benefits of outdoor activities, we recommend the following precautionary measures in tick-prone areas:

- Wear long pants, closed footwear and socks, and apply a DEET-based insect repellent, following the instructions on the product label.
- Shower as soon as you get home.
- Look for ticks on your body. Remove any ticks you find as quickly as possible. The risk of contracting Lyme disease within the first 24 hours of exposure is minimal. However, the longer a tick stays attached to your skin, the greater the chance of infection.
- Seek medical attention promptly if you develop any symptoms of illness (fever, headache, fatigue, rash more than 5 cm in diameter) within 30 days of a tick bite. Lyme disease can be treated successfully with antibiotics.
- Prevent tick populations from building up around your house by keeping your lawn mowed, removing leaves and bushes and creating a buffer between your yard and any wooded areas..

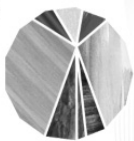

WHEREAS the declaration of jurisdiction for public and adapted transportation adopted on February 5, 2020 (resolution no. 04-02-20);

WHEREAS the adoption of the by-laws declaring jurisdiction for public and adapted transportation on June 3, 2020 (resolutions nos. 8782-06-20 and 8783-06-20);

WHEREAS bus transportation services are subject to a service schedule;

WHEREAS a new 2026 timetable was tabled at the meeting of February 18, 2026;

WHEREAS any changes to a municipal public transit service timetable must be published in service vehicles and a local newspaper at least 30 days before they come into effect. Transportation Act (CQLR, c. T-12, section 48.24)
